Where Does It Go!

This year we have begun to report on the projects that are funded by the Club's Charitable Foundation (SRCF). Now, we will begin to list and describe projects that the Club is doing, or has done, using funds from our Charitable Foundation, leveraged by District Designated Funds (DDF), and Rotary International (RI) Funds. Usually, we are able to leverage our funds by as much as 2 ½ when using DDF and RI funding.

Jitka Cymbal, Chair, International Committee, reports that through our Club's efforts, \$17,500 was donated to the Shrionkar Singh Memorial Fund in Delhi, India, to purchase an ambulance, so that doctors can travel to remote areas and perform life-saving surgery. The \$17,500 was comprised of \$5,000 from SRCF, \$5,000 from DDF, and \$7,500 from RI.
