of activities, from the Girl Scouts to the football team (as a manager) to the debate team. In her volunteer efforts, she often drafted her parents and anyone else she thought could help.

``I guess it comes from growing up in a small town,'' said Andy Stasek, her father. ``It doesn't occur to you that you don't help out when a neighbor needs something.''

Stasek will fly from New York to Paris to Baku, Azerbaijan, and then to Kabul. Stasek said she planned the trip so she could attend the public hearings on Tuesday and Thursday about the city budget, but she will miss next week's vote, as well as a possible study session on June 17.

Her trip has drawn mixed reactions from fellow council members, some of whom questioned the wisdom of skipping the budget vote.

``It's always important for people who take on responsibilities for the council to be available for both the deliberation and the voting on issues as they develop,'' said council member Greg Perry. ``Since I don't know exactly what's involved in the trip, I can't speak to the decision she made.''

Hands-on trip

Although Stasek visited Kabul largely as an observer last year, this trip promises to be more hands-on. The goal is to teach women a skill that might generate income, or at least save money that would otherwise be spent buying jams and jellies from a store.

She will also be meeting with local prosecutors in Kabul, trying to persuade them to release some inmates from the women's jail to the care of a shelter started by an aid worker she met during her previous trip.

``Some women are held because they had married boys their families didn't approve of, and there's a problem of them getting released,'' said Stasek. ``But some have nowhere to be released to. If it's to their families, they could be a victim of an honor killing.

``They are so deserving of our help.''
